#### A NOTE FROM PASTOR KAJLE

One of the greatest challenges that individuals and organizations face is focus - maintaining the effort required to pursue a goal or fulfill a mission. This might be possible to do on the short term, but as time goes on, that momentum is more and more difficult to maintain. I think this is particularly true in a time of transition. For us as a church, I felt we had a great degree of momentum as we rallied together for the next season of the life of this church. As we continue to walk through the process of solidifying our pastoral leadership, it is natural for it to be more and more difficult to maintain our focus. Let us be encouraged to fight against this loss of focus and instead push ourselves to what God is calling us to.

This idea of relentlessly refocusing our lives is a major theme in the writings of Paul. He encourages the Corinthians to "Run in such a way as to get the prize" (1 Cor. 9:24) and points out that he does "not run like a man running aimlessly ... not I beat my body and make it my slave." (vv. 26-27). Similarly, Paul tells the Philippians, "Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." (Phil 4:13–14)

But I think it is the author of Hebrews who gives us the clearest words of encouragement. After pointing to the myriad of Biblical and historical witnesses who persevered in faith, the author urges "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who has endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart." (Heb. 12:1-3)

We need to remember that God has called us to a massive vision - to bring renewal to our city. We are only beginning to take steps that have us more involved in the community and thinking about how the gospel has the power to transform us and those around us. We need to look to those around us who continue to persevere in fighting sin in their own life and in spreading transformation around them. In the past few months, we have pointed to people in our congregation who are intentionally thinking about how to alter the things they do everyday in order to build relationships with those around them that give opportunities to demonstrate and declare the gospel. And things are happening. Over the past few months, we've told stories of how a number of different people in our congregation are learning to live out our core values. And we will continue to do this. Beginning soon, our home groups will be exploring questions about what it means to live on mission where we are in an effort to practically demonstrate and declare the gospel to those around us. But ultimately, we look to Jesus and remembering what He has done for us, we serve Him

through serving others. Thank you for joining us in this.

#### Leadership at DHBC

DHBC is a congregationally governed church that is lead by a team of pastors (also called elders). What that means is that the congregation recognizes and elects qualified men to the role of pastor who bear the responsibility of leading

the church with the help of deacons. All major decisions are brought to the congregation for approval.

While we typically think of pastors as people with formal theological education who are paid to perform the tasks that they do (vocational pastors), the success of our leadership depends on quality *lay* (non-vocational) elders being raised up and affirmed by our congregation. Because of that, we invite you to consider if there are potential lay elders that you would like to recommend.

If there is someone that you would like to recommend for the important office of lay pastor, please pick up a copy of *A Guide for Recommending Non-Vocational Pastors* from the back table in the auditorium. This guide will help you understand the role better and discern whether a candidate is qualified. Should you wish to continue, Pastoral Nomination Forms are also available at the back table.

#### **IMPACT** and Partnership 2016

This coming April we will have our annual gathering of Fellowship churches (AGM) from our region (Pacific), meeting this year in Parksville, BC on Vancouver Island. This is always an excellent time of hearing about what God is doing in our churches, building relationships, and working together to have the greatest possible impact across our region once we return home. Our keynote speaker this year is **Larry Osbourne**, senior pastor of North Coast church in California and author of numerous books including "Sticky Church", "Accidental Pharisees" and

One special thing about this year's meeting in particular is that, as a region, we will now be given opportunity to vote on **Partnership 2016**, a pilot project begun five years ago, that seeks to bring about greater interaction and partnership among all the churches in our region. The goal has been to see greater gospel impact across our region as well as to increase the ability of the FEBPAC board to assist its churches. some of the ways that has benefitted us here at DHBC particularly is through initiatives like **church consultations** which was instrumental in helping us from our current three-year vision. Also, the **Immerse program** is also a result of this partnering of churches (as well as our seminary) that has seen two students come and serve in our church.

Our delegates will be seeking a recommendation from our church as to how we will vote regarding Partnership 2016 at our Timesterly meeting in March.
